CHILD PROTECTION AND VULNERABLE PERSONS POLICY

1. Introduction

- 1.1 Crowborough Town Council is committed to taking all reasonable precautions to safeguard the welfare of children and vulnerable persons that use its services and promotes a safeguarding culture and environment.

2. Safeguarding

- 2.1 The council will endeavour to safeguard children and vulnerable persons, in that:
- 2.1.1 The welfare of the child and vulnerable adult is paramount
 - 2.1.2 All children and vulnerable adults have the right to protection from abuse
 - 2.1.3 All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately
 - 2.1.4 All staff, volunteers and elected members of the council have a responsibility to report concerns to the appropriate officer
 - 2.1.5 No staff, volunteers and elected members of the council are to deal with situations of abuse or to decide if abuse has occurred

3 Duty of care

- 3.1 Any member of staff working alone with a vulnerable adult or children will be subject to a DBS check.
- 3.2 Crowborough Town Council has a 'duty of care' to protect others from harm; this includes a range of processes including risk assessment and health & safety practices.
- 3.3 Allegations or suspicions of inappropriate behaviour by a member of staff or Councillor must be referred immediately to the Town Clerk who will refer the matter to Children's Services at East Sussex County Council for investigation.
- 3.4 Allegations or suspicions of inappropriate behaviour by the Town Clerk will be referred immediately to the Town Mayor for investigation.
